



Innovation in Dry Flower Craft: Designing Photo Frames for Sustainable Art and Value Addition

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Dry flowers are an important source of natural material for creative crafts and value-added products. Dry flower craft provides an effective way to preserve the beauty of flowers and utilize floral materials that might otherwise be discarded. Materials Used for Photo Frame Preparation

The materials required for preparing dry flower photo frames are simple and easily available. These may include:

- Dried flowers
- Dried leaves
- Dried grasses and small plant parts
- Seeds and decorative natural materials
- Wooden, cardboard or MDF photo frame
- Adhesive or glue
- Scissors
- Pencil and ruler
- Decorative threads, ribbons or other materials
- Photographs
- Transparent sheet or glass for protection

The selection of dried flowers depends on their colour, size, shape, texture and durability.

Preparation of Dry Flower Photo Frame
